RAMADAN

Ramadan, the ninth month of the Islamic calendar, is a holy period marked by fasting from sunrise to sunset, one of the Five Pillars of Islam. This practice fosters spirituality, self-discipline, and empathy, encouraging reflection and acts of charity. Fasting includes abstaining from food, drink, and negative behaviors, with pre-dawn meals (Suhoor) and evening gatherings (Iftar) breaking the fast. The month, which shifts annually due to the lunar calendar, culminates in Eid al-Fitr, a festive celebration. Not everyone fasts; exemptions apply for children, the elderly, sick, or travelers, who may fulfill their obligation later or through community service.





Ash Wednesday is a holy day of prayer and fasting in many Western Christian denominations.
